

HONORING WARREN YAMAMOTO: 40 YEARS AS THE EDITOR OF WILIKI O HAWAII

When asked if we could write a feature on Warren Yamamoto's time as the Wiliki O Hawaii (also known as Wiliki) newsletter editor, he politely declined. For the past 40 years, Warren has been the driving force of Wiliki. Although Warren has collaborated with various organizations and contacts to feature their events and members over the years, he was modest in letting us do a feature on him. Despite his reluctance to step into the spotlight, we would like to commemorate his dedication to the monthly newsletter you receive.

The root of Warren's editorial legacy started back in the ninth grade at Kaimuki Intermediate School, where he took a class on creating the school newsletter. There, he learned how to build layouts for the ninth-grade newspaper. A couple of years later, in his junior and senior years at Kaimuki High School, Warren joined the yearbook club as the cameraman, where he connected with other aspiring reporters and continued to learn about creating publications such as the school yearbook and class newsletter. When asked why he decided to join these school organizations, Warren said it was something "new and different."

In the 1980s, Warren was active in multiple engineering societies and the president of a few, such as the Hawaii section of the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) and the Hawaii Council of Engineering Societies (HCES). In 1985, an issue was raised over the quality and content of HCES's monthly newsletter, Wiliki O Hawaii, and who would take over editing it. Seeing that no one was up to doing the job, Warren stepped up and voluntarily took over the role of Wiliki editor for the next 40 years until his retirement a few months ago.





For four decades, Warren has diligently served as editor of Wiliki every month. Putting it together was no simple feat, either. Each month, Warren would reach out to the point of contact for every engineering society that wanted to submit an article. Nowadays, these articles are easily emailed as a document, but in the past, it was handed to Warren personally at the HCES monthly lunch meetings at the old Ponderosa Restaurant on Kapiolani Boulevard. In the nineties, the articles finally transitioned to an online format.

After he received everyone's article for the month, Warren would print each out and upload them to a flash drive. He would then drive to Service Printers Hawaii on Dillingham Boulevard and drop off the printed copies. Service Printers would then make a galley sheet with the proper font and column widths, and Warren would swing by again to pick those up. Over the next few days, Warren would manually cut and rearrange each article to fit within the master newsletter layout. In this process, Warren would lay out the articles and ads on the galley sheets, measure each article to determine how many column inches of content there are for the articles, ads, and society logos, and make minor edits to the articles to ensure they fit. After the layout was complete, he would return the newly arranged articles to the printing company, where they would then be converted to an online format and

undergo a third set of edits. Even after Wiliki was finalized and printed, Warren would drive back to Service Printers to pick up any extra copies and distribute them amongst HCES meetings, the University of Hawaii College of Engineering office, and whichever society had the feature article for that month.

"I don't know how many times I submitted [an article] a week late, but Warren always seemed to get it into Wiliki. Warren seemed to have infinite patience with us." Says Sam Gillie, who was the HCES Chair in 1993, when remembering his time working alongside Warren on the HCES board.

Now retired, Warren enjoys spending quality time with his family and gardening, with a particular passion for growing and maintaining Bonsai trees, a hobby he has pursued since taking a course at Kaimuki High School in 1975. A dedicated member of the Hawaii Bonsai Association for nearly 50 years, Warren's commitment to this art form mirrors his dedication to Wiliki O Hawaii. Warren remains actively involved with the new editors of Wiliki, sharing his wisdom and experience to ensure a smooth transition. Looking to the future, Warren hopes Wiliki will "continue and expand more, maybe modernize."

Mahalo, Warren, for all of your contributions to Wiliki O Hawaii over the past 40 years!
